

# Bill A. Jones – Singing Bio

Best known as 'Rod Remington' on the hit TV show **GLEE**, **Bill A. Jones**

is also an in demand singer who swings the great Standards in the tradition of Frank Sinatra, Bobby Darin, Dean Martin & others.

Named one of LA's Best Concert/Cabaret Artists in BroadwayWorld.com, Bill has opened for Tony Bennett, Steve Tyrell, & The Mills Brothers. Other credits include touring with *The Glenn Miller Orchestra*, singing & emceeing in the stage productions of *Big Band Christmas* & *Battle of the Big Bands*, as well as performing with his own 6-piece group, *The A Players*. Bill's solo show "The Great Gentlemen of Song" is scheduled to make its New York debut in March 2019.

Bill's first CD, "Frankly" was released on [CDBaby.com](http://CDBaby.com) in 2010, and has now been joined by, "I've Heard That Song, Big Band Songbook," with tunes first made famous by the orchestras of *Glenn Miller*, *Harry James*, *Jimmy Dorsey*, and others. Bill is joined on this lovingly produced CD by songstress Bonnie Bowden (formerly with Sergio Mendes), and The 40's Fly Girls, a vocal trio that recreates the exciting Andrews Sisters sound.

For years, Bill was heard nationwide as a radio air personality. As a Voice Over performer, he was the 'Voice' of *The Fox Movie Channel*, and of American Airlines' in-flight audio program *Timeless Tracks*. An in demand Emcee and on camera Host, Bill's work has ranged from hosting *The Lumen Awards* for best lighting design, to *The Razzie Awards* for the worst films of the year.

In addition to *GLEE*, other television appearances include Comedy Central's *Workaholics*, *The King Of Queens*, *Everybody Hates Chris*, *Las Vegas*, *Days of Our Lives*, and many other shows. In commercials, Bill is still remembered fondly as the "Don't Count That" golfer in a memorable spot for FedEx.
